### 4.1 Description of first aid measures

Eye Contact	Rinse immediately with copious amounts of water for at least 10 minutes, holding the eyelids open. If irritation occurs obtain medical advice.

Skin Contact	Flush contaminated area with running water for 10 minutes, remove any contaminated clothing and launder before re-use. If irritation persists or there is any sign of skin damage seek medical advice.
